


25<sup>th</sup> Ave Sidewalk: Cost **\$535,000**, now **\$174,000 (67% savings!)**


## Our Approach to Walk-N-Bike Plan Update











### WalknBike 2017 **Vision Statement**

#### Access & Equity

Walking and biking will be accessible to all Nashville/ Davidson County residents regardless of age, ability, background, and income.

Walking and biking will seamlessly integrate with other modes of transportation, such as transit, and connect people to where they live, work, play, and learn.

**Objective:** Close the gaps where key connections to bikeways or walkways are needed

#### Collaboration

Walking and biking will be a safe and comfortable activity for everyone. Metro Nashville will continue progressing towards its goal of zero traffic fatalities and strive to minimize safety concerns for the city's most vulnerable users.


**Objective:** Partner with local organizations to offer a greater number of programs focused on walking and biking











### WalknBike 2017 What Was Done.

Developed recommended bikeway network

### Recommended Bikeways.

- Add 186 miles of bikeways for different rider levels
- Total cost \$88.8M




