In 2021 TSITE welcomed a new student chapter at the University of Tennessee Chattanooga bringing us to 6 active student chapters. The Fall Meeting was hosted in Chattanooga to welcome the new chapter and provide an opportunity for the students to network with TSITE professionals.



TSITE was represented at the 2021 UT Showcase for CE Graduates. This included a presentation and conversation about joining professional organizations and beginning their careers.

The Career Development Committee provided outreach and support for each of the student chapters throughout the year and TSITE supported attendance for 2 students from each student chapter to attend the 2021 International Virtual Student Leadership Summit.

Application of Technical Knowledge – Technical sessions at our meetings included applications of cutting-edge transportation elements. This included discussion on Big Data, Turbo-Roundabouts, Diverging Diamonds, Shared Mobility, Signal Modernization, TDOT SmartWay Congestion Management Initiative, TDOT's Work Zone Field Guide Innovations, Statewide TSMO Integration Efforts, Chattanooga's Smart City platform, and Rural ITS Deployments. TSITE sessions also included presentations on 6 active research projects.

Networking Events – Events for networking in 2021 included:

- Sponsoring awards for UTK Senior Design Project.
- TSITE members actively participated in SDITE's Mentorship Sessions.
- Chairing and participating in SDITE committees.
- Hosting joint meetings with Deep South ITE and ITSTN.
- Local networking meetings in the larger communities as COVID restrictions lifted.
- Student/New Member meet and greet with TSITE Board at the Summer Meeting.
- Social/networking activities for all members at quarterly meetings.
- Two annual golf tournaments benefiting the scholarship fund.
- Members attended multiple student chapter meetings.

K-12 STEM Outreach – TSITE members sit on the Professional Advisory Board for the T-STEM Academy at East High School. In this capacity they assist in the development of the school's curriculum, special projects, speaker series, and technical field trips. As part of this effort the TSITE Board and other section members provided comment and recommendations for the development of "<u>Transportation-STEM</u> <u>Academy (T-STEM): A playbook for developing transformational educational experiences through industry-academia partnerships</u>" and continue to provide assistance in expanding these programs across the United States.

Members have also remained actively involved with the Southeast Transportation Workforce Center (SETWC) at the University of Memphis since 2017. TSITE took an active support role in the development of "<u>Women in Transportation Playbook: Inspire, Engage and Empower</u>" for the USDOT. This document focuses on developing and implementing a strategy of encouraging the growth of women in all transportation fields beginning in K-12. With the playbook published members are continuing to support the initiative by attending and presenting at events, participating in school visits, serving on advisory boards, and providing internships and mentors for young students.

Across the State of Tennessee, TSITE members represent the Section through active participation in the Tennessee STEM Innovation Network. These hubs are based out of 7 cities with a regional reach. Members participating with this program speak with K-12 classrooms, work with teachers on incorporating real world applications into daily instruction, allow teachers to shadow them through a work day, provide apprenticeships for work study, and assist in professional development programs for teachers.



New Member Recruitment – TSITE membership continues to grow each year. The section is focused on joint meetings to increase our visibility with transportation professionals, strong engagement with state universities, and engaging retired members to retain their knowledge and experience. Throughout 2021 TSITE members volunteered as mentors and participated in networking events to grow interest in ITE.

Diversity and Inclusion – TSITE embraces diversity and inclusion in all aspects of our organization including valuing a balanced and diverse Executive Board to serve our members and by providing inclusion for STEM activities in diverse areas of our State. TSITE remains involved with the Southeast Transportation Workforce Center's objective to increase women and minorities in transportation and actively participate in the Annual Choosing Transportation Summit.

Training/Professional Development - In 2021 TSITE held both in person and virtual meetings due to COVID-19. Two of the meetings were jointly held with Deep South ITE and ITS TN. These meetings provided a total of 23 sessions and 16.5 professional development credit hours. Throughout the year TSITE sent out notifications and reminders for free webinars available from ITE and other organizations through email and social media platforms.

Field Trips/Technical Tours – 2021 Opportunities for Field Trips were limited as the Section moved back to in-person meetings after travel restrictions and other regulations from COVID-19 were lifted. To encourage attendance at meetings technical tours were not included in the agenda to help attendees feel comfortable.

Service Projects – In 2021 TSITE continued to support the distracted driving PSA student contest that was picked up as an annual competition for high school students by the West Tennessee STEM Hub. The program expanded in 2021 to include a logistics modeling competition. The Section did not promote a specific program for 2021, but supported members efforts in their communities by helping raise money, providing help with marketing, and helping find members to actively participate in activities.

Funding Support - TSITE instituted a Tiered Annual Sponsorship program, which is now included in an updated Operations Manual. Previously, TSITE would make various requests for sponsorship of meetings and events throughout the year. Now a call for sponsorship occurs in January and sponsorship is received and recognized according to specified tiers. The 2021 Annual Sponsorship Total was \$10,250, which went towards supporting the activities of ITE student chapters including the traffic bowl and leadership summit travel. TSITE members also contributed to the student scholarship fund in 2021, through hosting and participating in 2 golf tournaments, a scholarship auction during the Summer Meeting, and private donations.

LeadershipITE - Nearly all TSITE's 5 LeadershipITE alumni currently hold a committee chair position or officer position for TSITE or SDITE. Mr. Terrance Hill participated in the 2021 class and Beth Ostrowski was nominated and accepted to participate as in the 2022 class. While TSITE has not offered financial support for LeadershipITE tuition, our board has agreed to sponsor future candidates on a needed basis.

Advocacy - TSITE's Legislative Committee tracks and provides updates about national and local issues, legislation, and regulations that may be of interest or impact the transportation industry. These updates are provided during the business meetings at the quarterly meetings. TSITE worked with TDOT on contacting legislators regarding items of particular concern.
