This was a joint meeting with GAITE conveniently located in Chattanooga, TN.

In addition to the quarterly meetings, monthly and bi-monthly meetings are generally held in the local areas. Nashville now holds bi-monthly lunch meetings with a technical presentation and breakfast get-togethers without speakers on the opposite months. Knoxville typically has a lunch meeting every month or so with a technical session. Memphis, Chattanooga, and Tri-cities also hold 2 or 3 local area meetings per year. Coordinated through TSITE's Technical Committee, TSITE hosts and sponsors approximately 2 webinars across the state, offering more opportunities for members to earn PDHs at no cost.

Student/Younger Member Support

TSITE supports and coordinates with five (5) student chapters. In 2019, TSITE awarded five (5) student scholarships totaling \$6,800! TSITE also awarded \$500 for 1st Place and \$250 for 2nd Place in the student paper competition. All recipients of student scholarships and paper competition were invited to attend the Summer Meeting at no charge – registration and lodging was covered by the Section. The summer meeting offers networking and technical knowledge opportunities for students.

In 2019, TSITE sponsored a Senior Design Project Award for the University of Tennessee's Senior Day for Spring and Fall semesters. TSITE members reviewed the senior design projects and selected a team to receive the TSITE Award. Also, a TSITE representative attended the events and awarded the winning team members with \$25 gift cards and TSITE swag.

The Career Development Committee provided outreach and support for each of the student chapters throughout the year.

Application of Technical Knowledge

TSITE did not directly address a transportation issue or collaborate with industry on a project or program.

Networking Events

TSITE's 3-day summer meeting offers an abundance of networking opportunities during the daytime and evening schedules. All of TSITE's meetings include time allotted for networking since they are full-day events.

Additionally, the annual John Harper Memorial Golf Tournament offers opportunity for networking while raising funds for student scholarship.

K-12 STEM Outreach

Several TSITE members, particularly in the Memphis area, regularly engage with high school students at the T-Stem Academy ("T" for Transportation). The University of Memphis student chapter also participated in outreach with the T-Stem Academy.

New Member Recruitment

TSITE did not have a member recruitment event in 2019.

Diversity and Inclusion

TSITE aims to offer a diverse technical program at all meetings to appeal to all transportation professionals.

Training/Professional Development

Outside of the technical sessions during the quarterly meetings and local meetings, TSITE did not host/hold any targeted training events. In 2019, TSITE's meetings and webinar sponsorship offered approximately 22 PDHs for members. Some members also have the opportunity to receive PDHs at local monthly or bi-monthly meetings.



Field Trips/Technical Tours

Two of TSITE's quarterly meetings included technical tours.

The Spring Meeting in Memphis culminated in a multimodal tour into the intersection of transportation, development and tourism led by Stephen Edwards and Nicholas Oyler with the City of Memphis. Approximately 10-15 tour participants walked from the meeting to a downtown trolley station for a short ride down South Main Street past the National Civil Rights Museum to one of Memphis' B-cycle stations. The tour continued on bike along local streets and greenway paths to and across the Big River Crossing, which is the longest pedestrian and biking bridge over the Mississippi River from Memphis to West Memphis, Arkansas.

During the summer meeting, TSITE arranged for a technical tour of the Gatlinburg Skybridge – a newly constructed pedestrian suspension bridge and the longest in North America. The skybridge tour offered some bridge construction stats, but mostly notably some incredible views of The Great Smokey Mountains and town of Gatlinburg plus a little adventure on a beautiful day walking over the "glass panels" at the midpoint of the bridge.

Service Projects

TSITE did not participate in any community service projects in 2019; however, the Section began planning for its SDITE Service Project targeting the Prevention of Distracted Driving at the end of 2019 to be completed in 2020. TSITE completed the application for SDITE funding to support the service project, which includes a public service announcement (PSA) competition between the student chapters.

Funding Support

In 2019, TSITE instituted a Tiered Annual Sponsorship program, which is now included in an updated Operations Manual. Previously, TSITE would make various requests for sponsorship of meetings and events throughout the year. Now a call for sponsorship occurs in January and sponsorship is received and recognized according to specified tiers. The 2019 Annual Sponsorship Total was \$13,750, which went towards student traffic bowl travel and the summer meeting social activities. Without the significant support from TSITE sponsors, meeting registration costs would be higher for attendees.

The newly organized local meetings in Nashville have provided a new resource for student scholarship funding. Lunches are sponsored by a local firm or organization and the registration is a nominal \$10 per meeting. In 2019, these Nashville meetings contributed an additional \$1,100 towards the student scholarship fund.

LeadershipITE

Nearly all of TSITE's LeadershipITE alumni currently hold a committee chair position or officer position for TSITE or SDITE. TSITE does not currently offer financial support for LeadershipITE tuition, but we would be interested in best practices for application and review for distributing financial support in the future should the TSITE Board decide to begin proving support.

Advocacy

TSITE's Legislative Committee tracks and provides updates about national and local issues, legislation, and regulations that may be of interest or impact the transportation industry. Typically, these updates are provided during the business meetings at the quarterly meetings.
